CPTED – fear of crime relationship

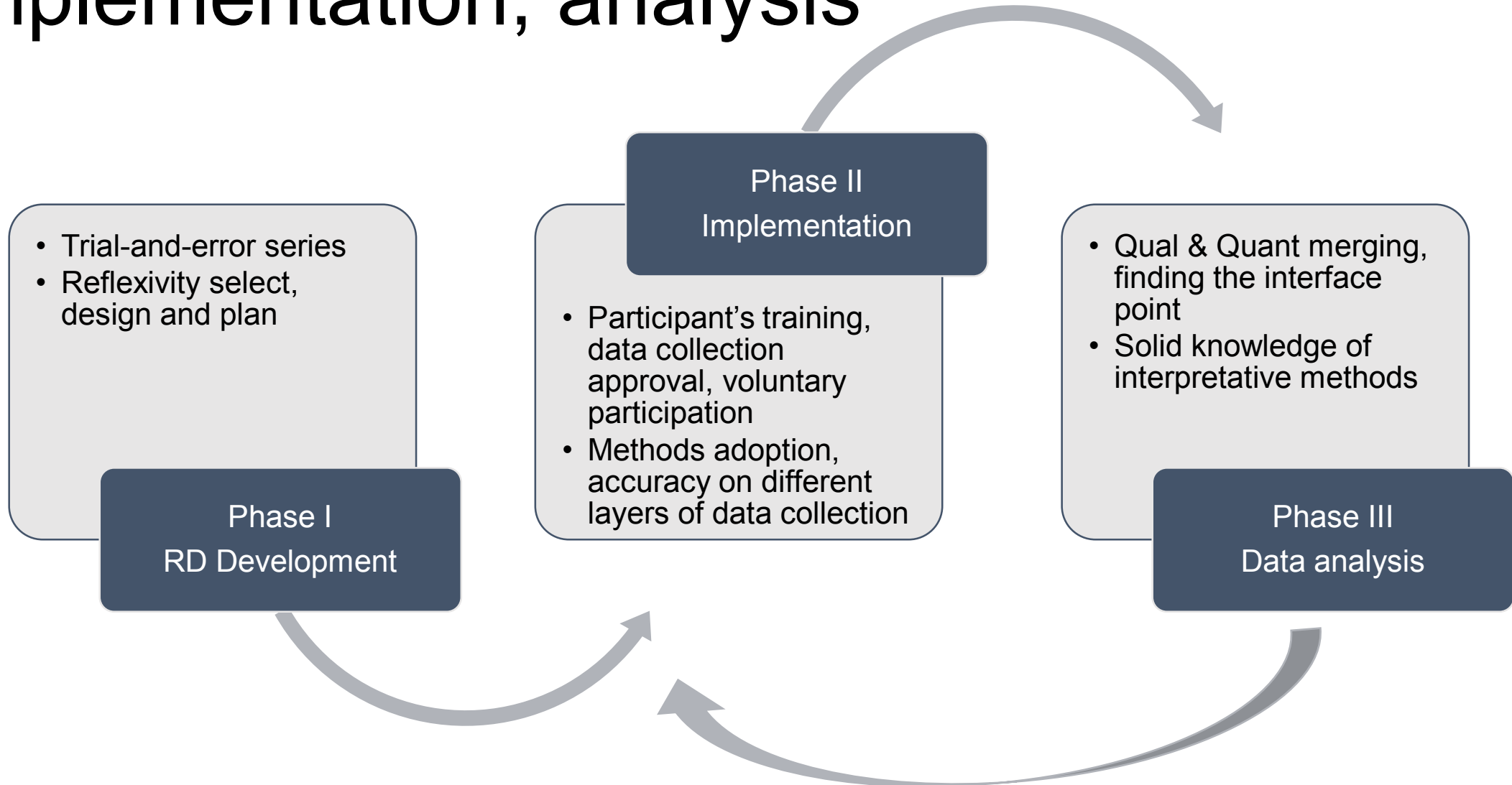


- In two US high-crime areas fear of crime caused:
 - 43% avoidance behaviours
 - 35% social isolation
 - 21% not walking
- “Paradox of fear” mismatch crime/fear of crime
- Not always victimized people present fear of crime
- Personal, social, and built environments influence on people’s fear of crime
